The Present Target group is 105 higher secondary students and 12 MSc students are also participated in this event. This is to attract students to basic science.





Field Visit and talk on organic farming

Field Visit and Talk on Organic Farming

-Department Of Economics

Department of Economics, St. Thomas College, Palai had undertaken a field visit to an organic farm at Plassanal near Bharanaganam on 27th November 2014 as an extension programme of the department. The Post Graduate students of the department accompanied by all the faculty members attended this very useful field visit. Students were the target group. Nutmeg, coconut, pepper, vegetables, and coffee were the major crops of organic farming in this farm.

The farm was owned by Prof. P. I. Devasia, former professor in the department of economics, St.Thomas College, Pala. On the occasion, he delivered a talk on organic farming and its relevance in the era of changing agricultural practices and strategies. He also stressed the need and benefit of the organic farming and the harmful effect of the use of chemical fertilizers. Further, he explained in detail the technique of organic farming and sustainable agricultural practices in the case of each crop, namely, nutmeg, coconut, pepper, vegetables, and coffee. Prof. P. I. Devasia also clarified all the doubts of the students.

It was a unique and different experience for the students and teachers. The visit motivated the students to initiate small scale organic farming at home. This visit was fruitful, informative and beneficial for all those who actively participated in the programme. Some of the retired teachers of the department also actively involved in the talk, discussions, and field visit.

Evolution is the process of interaction between the genetic variation and habitats. The habitat favours some variations to persist and some variations not to persist. The selection of these variations is different in different places of earth. The variations selected in one place may not be suitable in other habitats. This mutual compatebility between genetic variations and habitat is the process of evolution. This process is continuous and is subjected to many known and unknown factors. Climate change is one of the main factors that affect the evolution in a very serious way. Documentation of the impact of climate change is very important in this scenario to realize the magnitude of climate and also to design suitable measures to minimize the impact. Every habitat is equally subjected as the probable victim of impact of Climate change. Endemic habitats are more easily subjected as they are ecologically fragile lands.

Western Ghats is one of the global centres of biological diversity (Myers, 1998; Navar, 1996). It harbors large number of unique ecosystems throughout the entire length. Among these unique ecosystems Myristica swamp forests is very notable because it is related to the drainage systems of the Western Ghats. Myristica swamps are a highly fragmented, threatened and endangered freshwater swamp forest ecosystem of Western Ghats with distribution restricted to flat bottomed valleys with sluggish streams. Because of its humus rich and fertile soil most of the Myristica Swamp forests are converted to human habituation and agricultural lands especially for paddy cultivation (Bausaheb Tambet, 2005) and arecanut plantations (Krishnamurthy, 1960, Champion and Seth, 1968; Chandran et al., 1999; Chandran and Mesta, 2001). But five decades ago only this type of water-logged but high diversity area are described as special type of forests seen in T ravancore. Later from the valleys of Shendurney, Kulathupuzha and Anchal ranges of southern Kerala (Champion 8:. Seth 1968) and from Southern and Central parts of Kamataka and Northern part of Kerala'too (Bausaheb Tambet, 2005) this type of forests is located. The northernmost Myristica swamp so far reported in the Western Ghats is from Bambar in Satari Taluk of Goa (Santhakumaran et al. 1995, 1996). Myristica Swamp is also documented as an old habitat type in the Western

Ghats ie., more than 140 million years old (Chandran et al. 1999). It is assumed because of the presence of endemic species belonging to the families like Myristicaceae and Anacardiaceae. The swamps are associated with many endemic tree species also (Bourdillon 1908; Sasidharan & Sivarajan 1996; Ramesh & Pascal 1997; Chandran 85 Mesta 2001).

Idukki Wildlife Sanctuary has shown to be one that should not be underestimated in any policy decisions in Wildlife Protection measures. The total extent of the sanctuary is 105.364 sq.km which includes 33 sq.km water body of the Idukki Reservoir A recent plant diversity study conducted in this small (53 sq. km.) protected area has brought some very interesting facts about the richness of its Biodiversity. There are 5 types of vegetation in Idukki WLS. They are Moist Deciduous Forest, Semi evergreen forests, Evergreen Forests, Hill top evergreen forests and Grasslands. The Myristica swamp forests of this sanctuary was surveyed well. This type of forest is spread to an area of around 4.5 ha. in an altitude of around 900 meters asl.

There are 46 species of trees, 13 species of shrubs, 13 species of climbers, and 27 species of herbs in the Myristica swamp forests. Of the 46 species of trees 33 species are endemic to Western Ghats. Five shrubs, six herbs and three climbers are also endemic to Western Ghats. The breathing root forming species ie., Gymnacranthera farquhariana (Hook. f. 85 Thorns.) is enumerated and there are more than 250 individuals in this area. They are at different age classes. Regeneration is also good.

Though the extent of the Myristica Swamp forests in this sanctuary is only 4.5 ha. It is found worth in conserving by providing adequate conservation measures.





ST.EPHREM'S U.P. SCHOOL




Students and teachers of the Department of History at St. Ephrem's U.P. School, Kaveekunnu
