


Welcome to I D.C. Organized by III D.C. English

International Seminar

On 5.9.2016 an International Seminar was organized by the Department of English on 'Probing Alterities in the Postmodern Scenario' in the Library Hall. Dr. Clara A.B. Joseph of Calgay University Canada premiered the discussions on the subject. Dr. T.J. Abraham said Post Structuralism is strewn with dead bodies we see the death of God, Author, Man, the end of History and Philosophy. Both Levinas and Gandhi can offer an answer to the absence created by Post Structuralism. Both speak of the failure of Modernity or Enlightenment project as illustrated in Western industrialism and Nationalism. The Philosophical base of Post Modernism is Post Structuralism and it comes up with liberation of women and working class. There are no centers and margins. Thus a democracy was brought in. IN literature what we have is representation, Everything is fixed,ontologised. So Levinas rejects Literary art.


Activities of the Alumni Association


Back to the Sunny Days in the Campus of St. Thomas.
