#### **Preface**

LUX

The University Grants Commission (UGC), Govt. of India has introduced four year Under Graduate Programme. In adherence to this, through the introduction of new reference texts this newly designed syllabus equips students to German language, its nuances and syntaxes, appreciation of literature, culture, politics and life. It also aims to develop the skill of reading, writing, listening and speaking, along with the skill of translation with the help of dialogue patters, conversations in the target language. A candidate is enabled to make correct sentences in German and also able to lead simple conversations. St Thomas College Palai Autonomous was conferred autonomous status by the UGC on 19 January 2024 and subsequently Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam after due procedure, notified it only on May 7, 2024, which resulted in the delay of the constitution of various statutory bodies (Governing Body, Academic Council and Board of Studies) of our College. Therefore, the first Academic Council of St Thomas College Palai Autonomous held on 10 June 2024 decided to adopt the syllabus of Mahatma Gandhi University for the UG programmes of our college for the academic year 2024–25.
